FCC Discount on Internet

Emergency Broadband Benefit

The Emergency Broadband Benefits Program is an (FCC) program that provides a temporary discount on monthly broadband bills to qualified low-income households. If your family is eligible, you can receive:

- Up to a \$50/month discount on your broadband service and associated equipment rentals
- Up to a \$75/month discount if your household is on qualifying tribal lands
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer (with a co-payment of more than \$10 but less than \$50)

Only one monthly service discount and one device discount are allowed per household.

The FCC has announced that consumers can begin applying for and enrolling in the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program on May 12, 2021. The program will end when the fund runs out of money, or six months after the Department of Health and Human Services declares an end to the COVID-19 health emergency, whichever is sooner



Lowery Fire Department Receives Grant

Operation Round-Up Supporting Local Needs

The Lowery Fire Department recently purchased new fire helmets, which allow their volunteer firemen to work safely during fire calls and traffic accidents, thanks to a matching grant from the LREC Operation Round-Up program. The fire department researched and purchased 20 new MSA XF1 European-style fire helmets. The selection of the new style helmets was put to a vote by the fire department, which was overwhelming in favor of the newer style.

"Rural volunteer fire departments, we feel our men, are one of the important parts of our operation, and we want to make sure to keep our firemen safe when dispatched on a call. Without these volunteer firemen, we can not operate our equipment or run a truck to help our community. Keeping our firemen safe is one reason why we wanted to upgrade our helmets." mentioned Gary Erlandson, Assistant Fire Chief.

The grant received from Operation Round-Up was for \$3,565 matching funds to help with the purchase of these fire helmets.

Lowery Fire department primarily serves approximately 95 square miles around the Lowery, Moody, and Teresita communities and assists neighboring fire departments when needed.

Grants from Lake Region Operation Round-Up Foundation are made possible by LREC members who round up their monthly electric or fiber bills to the

nearest dollar. These funds are put into the foundation, which distributes them to individuals and organizations throughout LREC's seven-county service area.
