LREC Is Excited To Support Electric Vehicle (EV) Adoption

LREC is providing EV Tools and Resources at www.lrecok.coop/ev. Huge leaps have been made in battery technology, enabling electric vehicles to go further and become more affordable and more efficient. By making the change to EV, we can all save more money, enjoy more mobility, and have a cleaner world.

Why Go Electric

If you're considering an electric vehicle, you've probably heard how good they are for the environment. While this makes you feel good about your future purchase, you may still be on the fence about going electric.

Tax Savings: Did you know that when you purchase a new electric vehicle, you could be eligible for a federal tax credit of up to \$7,500? To learn more about this tax credit, visit the Department of Energy website.

Savings on Maintenance: When you drive a fully electric vehicle, there's no need for oil changes, fuel filters, new spark plugs, and



other costly maintenance. Instead, you can enjoy more money in your pocket as you drive to your next destination.

Fuel Savings: With an electric vehicle, you will no longer have to fuel up at the gas station, but instead, you can charge at home or any one of the hundreds of public charging stations across the state. While an efficient gas-powered vehicle can run for about 10-15 cents per mile, the average electric vehicle can run for just 3-5 cents per mile. Pennies per mile add up to significant savings over the lifetime of the vehicle!

Ever wonder why your power doesn't go out when our crews are setting new poles? Here is a picture of how it is done.

In this picture, Frank Teague is performing a new pole change out on energized lines. LREC crews are setting a new pole in-line with 3 hot (energized) wires. The orange on the lines is a non-conductive protective rubber, as well as the lineman gloves that protect the linemen from the 12,500 V of electricity screaming through the wires! Our linemen work on lines energized, so our members do not experience a power outage. Your electricity isn't something we take lightly.

Two Board Seats Up For Election



What does it mean to be a member and locally-controlled rural electric cooperative? It means you, our members, own the cooperative and are responsible for governing it through an elected Board of Trustees. Payment Options

We want to make it easy for you to pay your bill. Lake Region offers convenient ways you can make your payment.

- Bank Draft Recurring automatic payment plan. The amount owed comes directly out of your checking, savings, Visa or MasterCard account.
- Budget Billing we will calculate your monthly bill based on your average consumption from the previous year, and you'll pay a fixed amount each month for your electricity costs. Annually your account will be trued up.
- Pre-Paid is a pay-as-you-go program where you pay in advance for your electricity. This program allows you to make payments in any amount and at any time.
- Paperless Billing Save a tree and enroll in paperless billing. You will be notified by email every month when your bill is ready to view.

Stream TV and Movies on Smaller Screens

Use 4x less energy by streaming on a tablet.

When streaming movies, TV shows, and other content on a small screen, consider using a tablet if you have one available. This simple swap offers significant energy savings over watching on a big screen. A laptop uses 4 times the power of a tablet, while a desktop computer requires 15 times the energy.
